step 2

Click on the button "subscribe"

- You can now create an account
- Complete the required fields
- Click on "Create account"

step 3

Check your inbox

- You will receive an e-mail within the hour from "Botanic Garden Meise"
- If you didn't receive an e-mail, please check your spam folder
- Click on the link in the e-mail inviting you to activate your account and complete the registration process

step 4

Your registration is complete

part 2: getting started with descriptions

step 1

Visit www.museabrugge.be/GaremijnOntcijferd-doedat

At the top right, you will see "My Profile" instead of "Login". You are now logged in and ready to start!

· Click on the green "Start" button

step 2

You will now get an overview of the pages from the notebooks.

- · You can choose which image you want to start with
- Click on "Transcribe" if you want to transcribe and describe the image
- Click on "Preview" if you want to look at the image in detail first

step 3

Each time, a page will appear from one of the notebooks by Garemijn, kept in the Print Room of Musea Brugge. The page shows a pose or attitude of a model drawn by Garemijn with notes or names written on it. Sometimes it can be a combination of text and image.

- Can you read the text and describe the image?
 Then complete the fields below.
- Nothing springs to mind? No problem.
 Click on the "Back to preview page" button and choose another page.

step 4

Complete the fields using the input guidelines.

tips for viewing the image more in detail

With the symbols on the left side you can:

- enlarge or reduce the image
- rotate the image
- move the image up, down, left or right

With the symbols on the right side you can:

- open the image in a separate window
- lock or pin the image in your browser screen

You can adjust the contrast and exposure with the sliders in the upper left corner

1 Can you date the page?

- Is there a date on the page? Enter it here as precisely as possible. Use the Dutch name.
 - **Tip:** sometimes Garemijn used a number-letter combination as an abbreviation for the months:
 - o 7bre = September
 - o 8bre = October
 - o 9bre = November
 - o Xbre = December

2 Which day of the week is it about?

• Is a weekday mentioned? Fill it in here. Use the Dutch name.

collection data

- 3 Is there a drawing on this page? Indicate yes/no.
 - If yes, which pose or gesture does the drawn model hold? Are there several figures? Please indicate multiple poses.

special data

- What can you see in the drawing?
 - How would you describe the drawing? For a study after life drawing: how is the model captured? Is it a quick sketch, a line drawing or shaded drawing?
 - Here are some ways to describe a study from life drawing:
 - o Man seen frontally or from the back
 - o Nude or dressed, wearing a (loin) cloth
 - o In profile or turned three-quarters to the left or right (seen from the viewer's point of view)
 - o Looking up or down
 - Standing in contrapost posture (position with one leg extended and bent or relaxed), with legs apart, kneeling, reclining
 - o Outstretched, folded or relaxed arms, pointing (up, down)
 - Are any objects or props depicted (rope, stick, pedestal,...)?



- Write down literally all the text you can read on this page.
 - Copy the text from left to right and top to bottom, including punctuation.
 - Start a new line if a new line also begins on the page.
 - Follow the rules of Standard Dutch for capitalisation.
 - Pay attention to proper names.
 - o Always capitalise the first name.
 - o Write a lower case for van/der/van de(n) etc.
 - o The surname is capitalised. Example: Pieter van de Vyvere.
 - Transcribe in a logical order: group different blocks of text if you think they belong together. Work with a blank line between two blocks of text.

See example below: start transcribing the text above, then the text blocks at the left and the right side and end at the bottom of the page.



- Use square brackets for illegible text or doubtful cases.
 - o [illegible]; [jor Legillon?]; etc[etera]
 - o Still legible but crossed out: [Legillon, crossed out]
 - o Crossed out and no longer legible: [illegible, crossed out]
